**DELAWARE RIVER JOINT TOLL BRIDGE COMMISSION
TO PRESENT STATUS OF I-95/SCUDDER FALLS BRIDGE
IMPROVEMENT PROJECT AT EWING TOWNSHIP MEETING**

MORRISVILLE, PA – The Delaware River Joint Toll Bridge Commission is meeting with the Ewing Township Council during their Regularly Scheduled Agenda Session to provide a brief presentation to the Township about the status of the I-95/Scudder Falls Bridge Improvement Project on Monday, January 10, 2005 at 6:30 P.M. in the Council Chambers at the Township Government Complex located at 2 Jake Garzio Drive in Ewing. The meeting is open to the public.

The presentation will briefly summarize the purpose and need for the project and the scope of the environmental, engineering and public participation activities. The status of improvement alternatives that have been developed for the Scudder Falls Bridge, I-95 and interchanges in the project area will be the focus of the presentation. A question and answer period will follow the presentation. The goal of the improvement project is to relieve congestion and improve safety on the Scudder Falls Bridge and adjacent sections of I-95 in Pennsylvania and New Jersey.

The Delaware River Joint Toll Bridge Commission encourages the public to attend this meeting to provide comment and input on the improvement alternatives. Open Houses for the public will be held in Spring 2005 as the alternatives development and selection process progresses.
